The college is run by Hindustani Education Society, AUSA. It has greater interest for upliftment of the minority and rural students. The department of NSS provides special attention at the cleanliness. The staff and students cooperate in keeping the atmosphere beautiful. The college maintains a very cordial atmosphere with warmth of relationships among staff and students. At the same time, good discipline is maintained in the campus. In spite of the rural backgrounds of the students coming to the college, the result of the college is praise worthy. The teachers participate in seminars, workshops for academic development and present
